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

Walk in the footsteps of great pioneers and famous celebrities whilst wandering the cobbled streets of The Barbican and Sutton Harbour or setting off from the ferry port at Millbay. You'll be transported back in time to the departure of the Mayflower carrying the Pilgrims in search of the New World, to the days of explorers, Scott of the Antarctic and Captain James Cook. Take time to imagine when Walt Disney, Judy Garland and Charlie Chaplin all visited the city in their heyday to experience what Britain's Ocean City has to offer.

The city is bursting with maritime heritage and is famed for its long seafaring history. It is popular with visitors who delve into the city's past to discover naval prowess, Georgian elegance and Art Deco beauty.

Plymouth has a distinctly European feel, created by the many marinas, restaurants, alfresco pavement cafés and waterfront bars

Take in the marvellous views of Plymouth Sound, one of the world's most spectacular natural harbours and on Plymouth Hoe relive Sir Francis Drake's victory over the Spanish Armada. All this is just ten minutes' walk from the convenient attractions of a modern city centre and major shopping destination.

If discovering Plymouth's intriguing past, beautiful architecture and stunning views isn't what you're looking for this trip, why not engross yourself in a theatre show or surround yourself with the plethora of art on show in one of our theatres, galleries or performing arts venues?


This vibrant city nestles between the sea and rivers on three sides and the dramatic wild expanse of Dartmoor on the fourth.

At the cultural heart of Devon and Cornwall, you will always find something to enjoy in Plymouth, from amazing art to brilliant music and fabulous festivals.



## **Inspire**



You'll find cinemas and multiplexes too.

From the historic Elizabethan and Jacobean cobbled streets and galleries of The Barbican and Sutton Harbour, to the green space and dazzling, panoramic views of Plymouth Hoe, there's a huge amount to explore in Plymouth.

You can wander The Barbican's ancient cobbled streets, also home to Sutton Harbour's leisure marina and the UK's largest fish market and see how a sea captain in the 1600s would have lived in the Elizabethan House.

Take in the Mayflower Steps where in 1620 the Pilgrim Fathers set sail for the Americas.

Top up your knowledge of the city's history with a visit to the Plymouth Mayflower Museum in the Tourist Information Centre, before heading along Southside Street to join a tour of Plymouth Gin Distillery and see how the world-famous tipple is made.

Just over the footbridge visit the National Marine Aquarium, where you can learn about ocean conservation, meet Snorkel the loggerhead turtle or identify the different sharks on show, no matter the activity it's guaranteed to keep the whole family entertained.

## **Explore**

Leaving The Barbican and Sutton Harbour, you are just five minutes' walk from the stunning Plymouth Hoe, the living heart of our city, with its breathtaking views across the waters of Plymouth Sound.

You can climb the 93 steps to the top of the iconic 72ft lighthouse, Smeaton's Tower.

Take in the sights of Mount Batten, Drake's Island and the mile-long Breakwater, built by French prisoners of war in the 1840s. For a closer look, why not take a boat trip from The Barbican Wharves and see the ships of the largest naval base in Western Europe in Devonport Royal Dockyard? You can also take a Plymouth Waterlinks ferry to Mount Batten or to the Royal William Yard.

Back on dry land, the Hoe offers glorious views of the grounds of Mount Edgcumbe House, built in the 1550s and set amongst 865 acres of parkland. Hop on the ferry from Admirals Hard to visit Mount Edgcumbe giving you access to the dramatic Cornish coastline and quaint seaside villages of Kingsand and Cawsand.

After a day of discovery, take a break on the Hoe foreshore in one of its restaurants and cafés dotted along the terraces.

### **TAKE A WALK:**

There are a range of walks and trails to follow within Plymouth and the surrounding areas. Nestled amongst some of the most beautiful landscape in the country Plymouth really does provide fantastic opportunities to explore.

### **LOCAL TRAILS:**

**Waterfront Walkway:** Start at Admiral's Hard and enjoy scenic, thriving and peaceful parts of the city, ending up at Jennycliff after an invigorating 8.7 miles.

**Sutton Harbour Heritage Trail:** The one mile circular trail is the best way to discover everything Sutton Harbour has to offer, from its history and heritage to the best places to eat and drink along the leisurely 1.1 miles.

City Centre Nature Trail: With a third of Plymouth covered in green spaces and 8 public nature reserves this trail is a great way to explore the flora and fauna for approximately 2 miles.

**Devonport Heritage Trail:** The trail links historic and cultural points of interest in Devonport and is around 4 miles long.

**Plym Valley Trail:** The 10 mile cycling or walking trail offers great views and the opportunity to get close to wildlife, as well as being of interest to the geologist.




## **Explore**

# Head to Royal William Yard this summer...

Formerly a thriving Naval base, and now enjoying a resurgence as a must-see attraction, the Royal William Yard is a jewel in the crown of the South Coast. Fusing fun attractions, arts, culture and culinary delights - recently described by the Daily Mail as the 'foodie hub of the South West' - the area is fast becoming the destination of choice for Plymouth's residents and visitors. People of all ages, from young couples to families, it's open to everyone.

A collection of beautiful Grade I and II Listed buildings designed by 19th Century architect Sir John Rennie, the Royal William Yard fell into decline in the latter half of the 20th Century, closing for business and becoming a strictly no-go area.

With its stunning architecture and

waterfront position it was thankfully a prime candidate for conversion and just over a decade ago, it was given a deserved, rejuvenated lease of life by award-winning regeneration company Urban Splash.

Their wave of development has brought the area back to life by not only making it a great residential base - the hundreds of beautiful homes created there were described by the Financial Times as 'spectacularly restored' - but making it a real community with green spaces to play, cultural hubs celebrating in arts and events each day, plus great places to eat and drink.

It's now somewhere people live, work, visit for the day or even come on holiday, and the gates to the development - once a barrier preventing local people from enjoying the jewel in Plymouth's crown - are now fully open. Visitors can walk, cycle, drive, or even sail to the scheme and enjoy an array of events, including an award-winning monthly food market celebrating great local producers.

There is also The Yard's array of permanent restaurants and cafes - Bistrot Pierre, Prezzo, Wildwood, Seco Lounge, Wagamama, Las Iguanas, River Cottage Plymouth Canteen and the Royal William Bakery, where there's more on the menu than just great food. Architecturally stunning surrounds fuse contemporary aesthetics with historical features.

Enjoy an early drink at independent wine bar Le Vignoble. There you'll meet Yannick and his team, who'll educate you on the best wines to complement the mind-blowing views. Drop into Rockets

Art lovers can while away their days in The Yard's galleries; Martin Bush's studio within Gatehouse, Art Source in Residence One and there's the Ocean Studios exhibition space and studios – a hub for up and coming artists, which was launched by the Tate's Sir Nicholas Serota last year.

There are lots of new experiences

coming to The Yard in 2016 too. The Yard Sessions each Friday evening will bring BBQs and chilled-out live music evenings, showcasing some fine local talent, along with views out over the beach at Firestone Arch. For the health conscious, the Yard Fit circuits, paddleboarding and Yard Yoga are open to all.

Whether you want a Monday distraction – when Seco Lounge hosts its challenging quiz; a midweek treat – such as Le Vignoble's casual French language evenings every other Tuesday; or a weekend spectacular, there's no shortage of activities.

Above all, The Yard's beauty makes it a place to simply come and do nothing, grab a seat on one of our deckchairs, read a book and watch the world go by.


